Letter from an inmate: Thank you for listening, I greatly appreciate your newsletter each month, they give us inmates inspiration and just to know someone does listen to us. Yes, we have made a mistake to get ourselves incarcerated but we are still human, God wants us sinners because we turn to Him for forgiveness. Just as in John 8:7 says, "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw stones", No stones were thrown... I have been down since 2015 and just seeing parole and I was denied and given a year hit.

I'm married to my high school sweetheart 21 years, but the last two years she has stopped writing and answering my phone calls. We have three beautiful children. Our marriage and our children were all done in love and in the eyes of our beloved God. I know she's lonely and is missing her husband, about three months ago she sent me the dreaded divorce papers with no reason at all. My life suddenly felt useless. I know I still have my children to look forward to and would never do anything to jeopardize or hurt them, I just don't understand why she would give up on us after 21 years.

I know she deserves more than I can give her now and more than I ever gave her, but I never did her wrong and both her and our Lord know that. With all that, I started to question God and felt like I wanted to stop praying, stop attending catechism and stop reading the Bible, but I didn't, not totally. Prison makes it so easy to give up on everything but my Christian brothers both Catholic and protestant would not let me give up and fall. God bless them!!! I believe the Holy Spirit was at work in their hearts and in mine.

I don't want this divorce, she's the love of my life. Can you please send me something to help me in my time of trial, any literature on marriage and if possible the Bread of Life Bible study to go with it? We've always been good practicing Catholics and tried to live our lives right. Thank you for listening and I ask for your prayers for our marriage. God bless you and may God always light and make straight your paths, J.B.

Dear J.B., Yes, you are correct, our God is a loving, forgiving God. When we stray, we turn away from God. Jesus teaches us that we can turn away from sin and repent. When we repent, we will be welcomed home as was the Prodigal Son. Jesus understands that we are human and only He understands the depths of our anger, pain and loneliness. St. Paul writes about his loneliness to St. Timothy, "At my first defense no one appeared on my behalf, but everyone deserted me... But the Lord stood by me and gave me strength." (2 Tim. 4:16-17)

SPIRITUAL DIRECTION

What scriptures can prisoners memorize that will help us serve our time and stay out of trouble?

When Jesus became man He surrendered the power of His divinity, but retained the essence of his godliness, uniting it to His humanity. As He grew in human awareness, He always knew who He was, the eternal Son of the eternal Father. This understanding grew as His humanity matured. He always communicated with His Father, was about the Father's business, and did the Father's will.

In baptism a person's humanity is united with God's divinity. The person becomes a child of the Father, brother or sister of Jesus Christ, temple of the Holy Spirit. Many times, each day each person needs to remind themselves in prayer that, I AM A NEW PERSON IN GOD, just as Jesus always knew it. The baptized person is foreknown to be a part of God's family, predestined to bear the image of Jesus, called to New Life in God's Family, Justified — Freed from sin— and Glorified, that is showered with the grace of the Holy Spirit for the purpose of Proclaiming Jesus in word and deed. Romans 8 reminds a person of this, particularly Romans 8:28-31. Ephesians 1 echoes this. Corinthians 15:33, Do not be led astray: "Bad company corrupts good morals." 1 Corinthians 6:15-20, "united to the Spirit of the Lord and temples of the Holy Spirit." 1 Peter 2:9, "called out of darkness into the light, a chosen nation, a royal priesthood, a holy people called to proclaim the marvelous works of Jesus."
