Dear St. Dismas Guild, I absolutely appreciate all the materials you have sent. It is very incredible what God does for the ones who love Him back. In this dark, dank place of lost souls we, as good Catholics and as good Christians, need to be that lamp on the lamp stand for all to see. No matter what is thrown at us, as long as we walk with Our Lord, Jesus Christ, nothing can harm us.

I've been in prison now for over 22 years on a 30-year for 2nd degree murder. So, I'm 53 and had a heart attack a few years ago and a stroke a few years later. I have recovered 85% and probably won't recover much more, but to just look at me and watch me, you can't tell I've had a stroke. But God has never left my side. I've left Him a couple of times and us humans sometimes put doubt in our minds. But have faith! God is great. If it had not been for the love of God, I would not have made it this far.

Now I look forward to November of 21. I look forward to being home with my family spending quality time with those family members whom I've never met and those whom have known me for years. Some still hold hard feelings, but **God will work all of that out. God is great, and He has a plan in our lives, just trust in Him in the good as well as the bad.** Thank Him for our life experiences. Thank you, St. Dismas Guild, for your work and save as many souls as you can. Your Brother in Christ, P.C.

Dear P.C., you're right when you do go home God will work everything out. This time of isolation in prison has brought you to understand and trust in God. You have made your time in prison a seminary and not a cemetery. You obviously have come to know and trust in God through your study of His word. It's amazing how God allowed the heart attack and stroke in your life to happen to bring you closer to him and learn to trust in him. Continue to "Trust in the Lord with all your heart rely not on your own understanding, in all your ways be mindful of Him and He will make straight your path" (Proverbs 3:5-6).

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Dear St. Dismas Guild, It has been several years since I have written. For the most part, I had fallen away from my faith in God. At one point I had even considered writing you to have the newsletter stopped. However, I had a Catholic friend who enjoyed the newsletter, so I continued receiving them for his sake. He has your address but won't have you send the newsletter to him as long as there are others receiving it around him.

My lapse in faith was connected to the loss of my four-

year-old nephew, and then actions by the Pope during his American visit, which I took as evidence that God wasn't real. I'm not placing blame here, simply setting the picture. Truth is I was angry at the loss of my young nephew for no reason. And I couldn't "logically" justify a "loving" God allowing so much unnecessary suffering while the wicked prosper. I live so much in my head; I often forget the wisdom of the heart! Yet, God never gave up on me and I am once more

never gave up on me and I am once more called to His service!!

Your newsletter arrived in God's perfect time! As I stated, I have been denying God for some time, and only came to return to His embrace shortly after transferring here recently. Unfortunately, this place doesn't have a Priest visiting here and I only know of two other Catholics here, (though there may be more in 250 inmates). Thus, I have yet to go to confession and receive communion since turning back to God. And none of us here know how to contact the local Catholic Bishop to ask about getting someone to visit here occasionally. If St. Dismas Guild would help us obtain the Bishop's contact information, we will be grateful. Also, if it is not too much trouble, I would like to request a Catholic Bible and catechism.

Hello St. Dismas Guild, This letter is to inform you that I have a new address as well as ask for a copy of your wonderful book "Secrets to a Happy Family." I am currently serving a rather short sentence thanks to my many prayers to the Lord. I'm not a Catholic but I have long followed Catholic values. I am a **38-year-old father of seven children** with six here on earth and one in heaven. She would be turning 18 this year. When I lost her as a full-term stillborn it pushed me away from God because I thought "how could God take away a gift from above." It wasn't until I got locked up this time around facing 25-to-life that I even considered giving religion a try again.

I went to Catholic Church service and received the form for you guys and got my first Catholic Bible. I like reading from it. I feel the translation is perfect and the footnotes are far superior to those found elsewhere. I feel a large change in my life, and **I can't imagine** where **I would be had I not decided to** give Jesus another chance. He has delivered me from a 25-to-life sentence facing a 3rd strike to getting the strike dismissed at prelim. And the first words out of my attorney's mouth were "Thank God." I spent that morning praying the Prayer for Victory that you sent me with the Bible. I even carried the paper with me to court that day! I feel so blessed to have had my future go to 65%! As it stands, my date is next year, but with milestones I could be home before Christmas.

I would like to thank you for everything and also ask for a spiritual mentor to help me on the road toward putting my marriage and life back together, since, thanks to the Lord, I get another chance to be a husband, father and son again. Sincerely, L.A.

The recent changes in abortion law in many states such as Alabama and Louisiana is something kept fervently in prayer for many years.

As Director and Assistant Director of Rachel's Hope Healing ministry, we facilitate healing retreats for women who have had abortions. For two days, we witness the excruciating emotional suffering abortion inflicts on vulnerable and frightened women. Thanks to Planned Parenthood and other abortion facilities, these women had the procedure, not knowing or being advised of the devastating psychological, spiritual, and physical trauma waiting to attack them afterward. Trauma waiting to destroy every aspect of their lives ... their self-esteem, self-worth, relationships, faith, employment, parenting, etc.

The process of healing is emotional and painful, but the result is worth it, but as these courageous and injured women started the process, they could not yet feel the love, forgiveness and hope to come from God's infinite mercy. While listening to their stories and watching the tears flow down their cheeks, our minds wander back to the time we too fell victim to the misleading rhetoric. Our hearts threaten to break into tiny little pieces but, praise God, through the healing received; we have the tools to avert a complete melt-down.

After each retreat, our commitment to pro-life grows tenfold. Planned Parenthood and their counterparts *should* be more than willing to advise their clients of the potential side effects of abortion. They claim to be the major defender and caring (?) provider of women's healthcare, after all. But then, if the truth was known, women would think twice about abortion, and clinics would no longer rake in the millions of dollars, forcing them to close their doors (what a wonderful thought) thus saving the lives of our precious unborn and the hearts and souls of the mothers and others involved in the abortion decision.

Abortion providers not only profit from the deaths of innocent lives, but they also take advantage of the frightened, the poor, the coerced, the vulnerable, and the misinformed. They must be stopped! How? By each parishioner getting involved in pro-life activities and voting only for pro-life candidates. Remember ... silence is consent.
