TESTIMONY

Dear St. Dismas Guild, Hi! My name is J.L. and I'm 33 years old. I just want to thank you for the resources you provide and your monthly newsletter. I was raised Catholic, but in my teenage years I turned away from my faith, and for almost 20 years I turned to drugs and alcohol for comfort and happiness. I never found enough comfort and happiness no matter how much I used, and I realize now that I was just slowly killing myself trying to fill a void that only Our Heavenly Father can fill. When I first got to prison it was business as usual, and I got high or drunk as much as I could. I fell into a deep depression because of the guilt and shame I felt being separated from my family, and when drugs and alcohol could no longer dull the pain, I decided I was done living.

God had other plans. Instead of giving up and leaving my 8-year-old daughter fatherless I sought help from psychiatrists and medication, but it didn't work. Then God put a special person into my cell, and he shared the Word of God with me, got me reading the Bible and praying for help. Shortly after that someone gave me the Bread of Life Bible Study workbook and a copy of Rediscover Catholicism. I started attending church again and got signed up for NA and AA. Through petitioning God and fasting He cured me of addiction and depression.

Now I'm working on getting a degree in Drug and Alcohol Counseling and Christian Counseling. I'm taking up my cross to help other addicts and people suffering from depression while serving my sentence and will continue when I get out. I would LOVE to be a part of your spiritual mentoring program so I can learn from a mentor how I can help others more effectively.

I can't thank you or God enough for providing the Bible and Bible Study workbook that helped save my Life. Sincerely, J.L.

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Dear St. Dismas Guild, Your July 2019 newsletter featured two letters from subscribers who each had **struggled with the loss of a young family member.** One reader failed to find any logic to justify how a loving God could allow a 14-year-old nephew to die. The other felt distanced from our creator after losing a full-term daughter at birth. Perhaps it may help them to turn to the Word of God to comprehend His wisdom.

In our eyes we perceive our own personal loss of LOVED ones as a tragedy, especially in dealing with the loss of a child. Could there be any greater pain in one's heart? As a natural response of this world we thus tend to react in contempt toward God. Yet, His ways are far above our own and, as Job discovered, in this lifetime we may never fully understand Him. God helps us, though, by speaking to us in His sacred word. It is there, in the gift we call the Holy Bible, that we can find an answer to how a loving God could allow this. **The Book of Wisdom speaks of dying at a young age as a blessing, not an affliction.** It's an act of divine providence that the lucky ones are lovingly "snatched

up” in their innocence of youth in order to protect them from the evils of this world:

“The souls of the righteous are in the hand of God, and no torment shall touch them. They seemed, in the view of the foolish, to be dead; and their passing away was thought an affliction and their going forth from us, utter destruction. But they are in peace. For if to others, indeed, they seem punished, yet is their hope full of immortality.” (Wisdom 3:1-4)

“But the righteous one, though he dies early, shall be at rest... The one who pleased God was LOVED, living among sinners, was transported—snatched away, lest wickedness pervert his mind or deceit beguile his soul...” (Wisdom 4:7, 10-11, 13-14, 17-18)

Please share this message for all who grieve such loss and encourage your readers to study the Book of Wisdom and the Book of Sirach for more insight. God bless, B.H.

SPIRITUAL DIRECTION w/Fr. Richard

Due to my incarceration I'd like to know what are **mortal sins** that I could be committing without knowing? Someone told me that to relieve oneself (ejaculate) is a mortal sin. Is that true?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church reveals in number;

1874 To choose deliberately - that is, both knowing it and willing it - something gravely contrary to the divine law and to the ultimate end of man is to commit a mortal sin. This destroys in us the charity without which eternal beatitude is impossible. Unrepented, it brings eternal death.

2396 Among the sins gravely contrary to chastity are masturbation, fornication, pornography, and homosexual practices.

2352 By masturbation is to be understood the deliberate stimulation of the genital organs in order to derive sexual pleasure...

Thus, masturbation is always grave matter which can cause the sin to be mortal, so it should be avoided as you grow in chastity.
