TESTIMONY

Dear St Dismas Guild, I want to thank you so much for the materials you sent me. As well as for everything else you do for Catholic inmates and those who are trying to understand the faith better. I honestly don't know what I would have done if it wasn't for St Dismas Guild. In such a hopeless place as prison there isn't a lot of people you can turn to. Spiritually, as a Catholic I try to bring others closer to God, through good example and doing good works for others, but as far as being able to relate with other Catholics, we are few and far between.

...The crime I committed was an honest mistake and I have apologized whole heartedly to the person as well as to their family and to the community...

During my incarceration I have taken the time to complete numerous self-help groups and substance-abuse classes to help ensure that an incident like before never happens again. I was originally sentenced to 38 months to 15 years for the crime I committed even though it was a non-violent act and the victim stated in court that she didn't want me to go to prison for what I did, but that was eight years ago...

Before coming to prison, I was far from a model citizen, but I was a productive member of society. I worked hard to provide for my family, and always had a legitimate job. I served in the military honorably and went to church on Sundays to pray to God. Just not every Sunday and didn't pray for the right reasons. I was raised in a strict Catholic family, believed in God and the Lord Jesus Christ, but somewhere along the way I became lost and never formed a personal relationship with HIM. I see now the error of my ways and that many of the problems I face in life stem from this.

So, I've also taken the opportunity during my incarceration to build on that foundation, strengthening my relationship with God. I now read scripture daily trying to come to a better understanding of the Word of God. I'm trying to become the best person I can be, the person God created me, in all aspects of life. So, it doesn't bother me what others think of me, because when I look into the mirror and see my reflection, I am happy with the person I see, and I know the Lord is too.

Again, I thank you so much for what you have done for me over the past eight years. I love reading your newsletter every month. Cycle A is now fast approaching, and I would like to ask if you could please send me the Bread of Life Bible Study Cycle A and a new Bible, as well as the book "You Visited Me" by Fr. Paulsen. I look forward to hearing from you soon. God bless, R.H.

we have no more copies available. A Bible and Cycle A Bible Study workbook are on the way. Have a blessed Christmas.

There is so much truth in that song that I want to use it as a way to illustrate to you all who are currently incarcerated, that no matter what the current conditions are you still can choose Good over evil, Light over darkness, Peace over aggression, Strength of character over weakness of spirit. I have included the lyrics of the song here:

He said I was in my early forties with a lot of life before me and one moment came that stopped me on a dime, I spent most of the next day's looking at the x-rays, talking 'bout the options, And talking bout' sweet times.

I asked him when it sank in, that this might really be the real end, how's it hit 'cha when you get that kind of news? Man, what'd you do? He said...

Chorus: I went skydiving I went Rocky Mountain climbing I went 2.7 seconds on a bull named Fu Manchu, And I loved deeper And I spoke sweeter, And I gave forgiveness I'd been denying, And he said, "Someday I hope you get the chance to live like you were dying."

He said I was finally the husband that, most of the time I wasn't, And I became a friend, a friend would like to have, And all of a sudden going fishing, Wasn't such an imposition, And I went three times that year I lost my dad, I finally read the Good Book, and I took a good, long hard look at what I'd do if I could do it all again.

Never forget that we are all dying from the moment we come into this world.... make sure you live like you are dying by doing all that you can to glorify the God that made you and saved you!

"When I read the Bible, I don't know where to begin, what would you suggest?"

Years ago, when I started reading the bible, neither did I know where to begin. The bible can be divided into **Sections** - the law, historical, wisdom, prophets, gospels and acts/epistles.

The Old Testament –

The Law: Genesis to Deuteronomy

The Historical Books: Joshua to 2 Maccabees

The Wisdom Books: Job to Sirach The Prophets: Isaiah to Malachi

The New Testament -

The Gospels: Matthew to John

The Acts of the Apostles & The Letters

Start at the first book in each **section** and read chapter 1. Next day read the next chapter from the same book in the section. You will finish some sections faster, so just start over in the same section

Continue to read the other sections and then start over when done. **6 chapters each day.** Then it will start to make sense. Bless you in your faith...
