TESTIMONY

Hi, I am writing you because I appreciate the literature you've sent me, and I have to learn more. About me, the proper term for what I am is a pedophile. It's only recently that I've become honest with what I am and who I am, due to my charges. And people abuse me, they hit me and spit on me, call me names, and I understand how they feel. I know I am scum.

I prayed to my Lord to take these urges away from me. I hate who I am, and I wish I wasn't this way. I pled guilty to my charges and I'll always be known. Sometimes I read the Bible and I pray the Rosary. I always wear a Rosary around my neck. I pray to the Virgin Mary for help.

My question is - - do you think I can ever be forgiven? Can somebody like me be forgiven? I can't even have contact with my own kids. Do you have any advice for me? I'm hurting inside. Thank you. J.M

Dear J.M., I speak to you of repentance, forgiveness, temptation, identity, and consequence of sin. Yes, absolutely God will forgive you IF YOU REPENT OF YOUR SINS AND ARE SORRY, even though the temptations may remain! God will forgive; society, other prisoners, and those offended may not.

Acknowledge the misdeed and the continuing temptation in your life. You have done that in your letter. We are men and women in Christ, NOT our sins unless we choose to give over to them and identify ourselves by them with the intention of committing them again. The reestablishment of your identity as a child of God and not "pedophile" is part of the gift of forgiveness.

Still, the consequences of sin remain. The damage done to others through sexual abuse will affect their future sexual development. For them, as for you, there is hope in Christ. Since the temptation to commit pedophilia is known to be so strong, your children and future grandchildren may be isolated from you, at least unto adulthood.

In the prison system are others who find it easier to judge another rather than to face their own misdeeds, thus your current suffering from them. You have a repentant heart. Confess your sins to the priest. Receive the absolution. Make your act of contrition to God. Do the prescribed penance, knowing that conversion from this sin is a lifetime walk with your Savior, Jesus Christ. Bless you in your faith... Acts 3:19 "Therefore repent and return, so that your sins may be wiped away, in order that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord..."

DOING TIME WITH JESUS

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Dear St. Dismas Guild, Thank you for the information you have sent me. I don't know how or why you blessed me, but I read all the time, five to ten hours a day. I've been doing it for many years now. Also, I'm an ex-gang member, in the junior Mafia. I found our church in jail. I was 17 years old. That is the age I first prayed the Rosary and the age I received Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion. I was Baptized during Benedict XVI's reign as Vicar.

I'm somewhat well read, although I am a peasant and never got a GED, I read the Bible, Catechism of the Catholic Church and True Devotion to Mary. I read the first thing every morning from the Missal. I learned that many are called, but few are chosen. We have to have merit and good deeds to make it to Heaven. Mercy is cool, but once you learn you have a responsibility to use your wisdom. Trees are judged by their fruits...

To our fellow Servants, As president of the **Saint Dismas Guild Prison Ministry** it is my mission to solve more problems than I create. Our team of volunteers, along with our small efficient staff, has dramatically increased the number of prison facilities that we serve in the U.S. **That increase has become the solvable problem.**

We have:

- **Increased** the number of prisons being served **from 704 to 803** (from January 2019)
- **3,173 Inmates** receive our monthly newsletter which inspires them and encourages them to give their life to "knowing, loving and serving God....and no other"

SPIRITUAL DIRECTION w/Fr. Richard

"In the Old Testament the authors state that God commanded the Israelites to slaughter entire civilizations. This is a different God than the one Jesus portrays in the New Testament. So, were the authors of the O.T. incorrect as to what God was saying to or wanted from the Israelites?" J.A.

Dear J.A., Scripture's first sense is the situation in time. All life belongs to God; He can allow conception or call life back to Himself. God wished to establish His people in the land He chose for them to worship Him alone. He knew their weakness in associating with tribes who worshiped false gods. God also knew that if the other tribes were not killed, they would gather again to destroy the chosen people.

With the arrival of the Jews as the enemies of the people already there, the pagan tribes could flee before the fight. If not, they would be killed. They in turn would kill the Jews if they had the chance. This was the situation of the ancient world. Thus, the Jews were to destroy the people who did not flee, tear down their altars, drive out the mediums and fortunetellers, destroy all pagan cults, priests, priestesses, temples. They were forbidden to intermarry with pagans who might lead them to false worship.
