Dear St. Dismas Guild, first off, I want to thank you for all that you all do for those of us who are forgotten. Four years ago, I left the Church and converted to Islam and it was a dark four years. As one of my Catholic brothers told me, I had turned my back on Jesus. Somewhere around October of last year I started feeling the pull of Jesus, so I prayed to Jesus for the first time in four years. I talked to Him like an old friend and I asked for clear signs on my next move. I received my signs and in November I was moved to another prison. When I arrived, I found out that there was no Catholic service and only two confirmed Catholics at this prison.

I knew then what my next move was, so I went to work. I visited the Chaplain many times and wrote many letters for help and I prayed a lot! Here it is almost four months later, and we have a priest who is about to start having Mass for us, and our community has grown to 11 Confirmed Catholics and two brothers who are looking to join the Church. All praise to God! We still need a lot of help and prayer, but I feel as if Jesus showed me my job and I think He would say now "Well done my son."

I also had help from a few beloved people, St. Erasmus, St Teresa "The Little Flower", St Anthony of Padua and, most of all, our Mother Mary. She appeared to me in a dream and brought me so much peace and strength to keep going when I wanted to give up. Once again, thank you and May God bless you always.

I would also like to know if you could send me a Catechism, a prayer book, and a list of any other materials you offer. Also, I would like to know if someone would be willing to correspond with me for help on my spiritual journey. I used to write to someone there, but we lost touch when I left the Church. Thank you again, and May God Bless you all for all you do. With Love in Christ, A.B.

In the preface of the NAB it says that the first eleven chapters "have been borrowed from creation-flood stories attested in Mesopotamia literature of the second and early first millennia." Is this true?

The introductions to each of the books that you cited in your letter are NOT the Bible, rather they are attempts at showing some understanding of how situations in time, experiences even of non-believers show some similarities. These introductions to each chapter are attempts to explain POSSIBLE historical contexts.

Read the bible and let the Holy Spirit speak to you, just as I ask Him to teach me the bible every day. The introductions give me some opinions, but the words of the Bible give me God's truth: His Word to my soul.

Genesis shows that God created everything out of nothing.

~ *He set the days and the nights.*

~ He created the stars (because other religions *believed the stars were gods*).

~ He created all living creatures (which other religions worshiped as gods).
