I was raised going to church but only went to keep from getting a spanking. After I got my time (30 years ago) I totally quit caring. I would fight, buy books with girly pictures just to have something to do. Yes, I felt it was wrong, but I did not care. As time went by each year, I lost a family member. In 2007, I was challenged to try college and at the same time I was invited to a Catholic service on my unit. I went to church and felt the COMFORT and LOVE of Christ. My mind was at ease. I have even been placed as the Catholic coordinator on five different units out of eight that I've been on. I share your newsletter each month with friends here inside the prison and give them words of encouragement. I now tutor, mentor, and guide people to Christ Jesus as He sees fit to use me as a vessel. These 20+ years have been a great life changer and it was done only by HIS GRACE and LOVE.

I made parole back in February and I am now in a program to transition, my prison thinking back to being free from these earthly bonds.

Thank you for all your support and letters, they are a blessing. My advice to those who read your newsletters, Keep the Faith and Pray Daily and Thank HIM for the answers even if they haven't happened yet. He knows the desires of your heart.

May God bless you all, in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Amen. R.F.



SACRED TRADITION

THE CHURCHES DEDICATION FOR DECEMBER:

"...is dedicated to the **Immaculate Conception**, which is ordinarily celebrated on December 8 but since it falls on a



Sunday, the feast has been transferred to December 9. The first 24 days of December fall during the liturgical season known as **Advent** and are represented by the liturgical color purple — a symbol of penance, mortification, and the sorrow of a contrite heart. The remaining days of December

mark the beginning of the **Christmas** season. The liturgical color changes to white or gold — a symbol of joy, purity and innocence." (catholicculture.org)

A Few FEAST DAYS:

Dec. 8th – <u>Immaculate Conception of Mary</u> – The Immaculate Conception is a dogma of the Catholic Church which states that the Virgin Mary was free of original sin from the moment of her conception.

Dec. 9th – <u>Juan Diego</u>, On December 9, 1531, when Juan was on his way to morning Mass, the Blessed Mother appeared to him on Tepeyac Hill, she told him to climb the hill and to pick the flowers that he would find in bloom. He obeyed, and although it was wintertime, he found roses blooming. He gathered the flowers and took them to Our Lady who carefully placed them in his mantle and told him to take them to the Bishop as "proof". When he opened his mantle, the flowers fell on the ground and there remained impressed, in place of the flowers, an image of the Blessed Mother, the apparition at Tepeyac.

Dec. 12th – <u>Our Lady of Guadalupe</u>, since 1531, Our Lady of Guadalupe, or the Dark Virgin, as she is often called, has become the patron saint of the Mexican Republic. Historically and emotionally, the Virgin is deeply woven into the life of every Mexican. During the wars of independence, she was the patroness of the Mexican armies Almost every Mexican town has a church dedicated to Our Lady of Guadalupe. And people turn to her for help and guidance on every occasion. She is also referred to as the Patroness of the Americas.

Dec. 25th – <u>Christmas</u>, Today the Church celebrates the Birth of Jesus Christ, the first day in the octave of Christmas. The Christmas feast is a festival full of joy. The Eternal Word has become Man and dwells among us.

Dec. 27th – <u>Feast of the Holy Family</u>, This feast is a liturgical celebration in the Catholic Church in honor of Jesus of Nazareth, His mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and His foster father, Saint Joseph, as a family. The primary purpose of this feast is to present the Holy Family as a model for Christian families.
