

As my beloved father said, sometimes, nothing is the best that can happen to us.

May God give you wisdom and judgment and guide us to the correct road. May God fill you with all my love and happiness and allow me to enjoy through God’s love all your

Can you help me understand "Redemptive Suffering" and how suffering can have meaning in my life?

What kind of suffering can be "offered up" and who can it be offered for? Also, is it appropriate to offer up menial daily tasks such as cleaning, or working out, etc. like for the conversion of my wife or son, etc.?

All types of prayer offered to God, including daily tasks that are given by Him and offered back to Him with Jesus are a response to His grace. There are two kinds of grace: **sanctifying grace**, that presence and power of Jesus that makes us holy, and **actual grace**, that power and presence of Jesus that prompts us and empowers us to respond to any situation through Him, with Him, and in Him. People should ask God for anything, and He will purify the prayer and answer it according to His will for our benefit. "Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing." 1 Thess. 5:16-17

PRO-LIFE

* "The government should not interfere with someone's personal choice." This is neither practical, desirable, or correct. If there is only one legitimate function of government, it is the protection of innocent human life and to prevent one individual victimizing another. The word "choice" might sound good, but the reality is that some "choices" are crimes, and all crimes are "choices".

* Abortion advocates try to use smokescreen language to conceal the truth about abortion. A good example is the term "women's reproductive rights". The biological reality is that when a woman is pregnant, reproduction has already occurred. If that were not true, there would be nothing for the abortionist to abort.

* Another deliberately misleading term is "woman's access to healthcare". Healthcare relates to the treatment of diseases, injuries, or illnesses. Since pregnancy is none of these, **abortion is Definitely Not "healthcare."**

A Few FEAST DAYS:

April 1st 2nd 3rd - Sacred Triduum - The last three days of Holy Week are referred to as the Easter or Sacred Triduum (*Triduum Sacrum*), the three-part drama of Christ's redemption: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday.

April 4th - Easter Sunday - Easter is the Feast of Feasts, the pure joy and gladness of all Christians.

April 23rd - St. George - He belonged to the Roman army, was arrested and, probably, beheaded under Diocletian, c. 304. He is the patron of England, since 800. St. George is one of the "Fourteen Holy Helpers." **Patron:** archers; butchers; equestrians; farmers; field workers; horsemen; leprosy; plague; skin diseases; soldiers; syphilis.

April 23rd - St. Catherine of Siena – born in Siena, was favored with visions from the age of seven. Dominican Order, she acquired great influence by her life of prayer and extraordinary mortifications as well as by the spread of her spiritual writings. She died in Rome on April 29, 1380. **Patron:** bodily ills; firefighters; illness; miscarriages; nurses; people ridiculed for their piety; sexual temptation; sick people; temptations. ~ catholicculture.org
