I am transferring to a halfway house and wanted to inform you so you can remove my name from the mailing list. Please keep up the good work and know that you had a part to play in keeping me strong in my faith and getting me through this tough time.

As a point of observation, I have noticed most Catholics don't know how to talk about their faith and most Christians don't know what the church stands for and what distinguishes it from any other "Christian" group. Of course, this isn't news to anyone who takes an active role in evangelization, but I would suggest your newsletter, add phrases or sections that teach how the Catholic church is the church founded by Jesus Himself. We are the original Christian church, and all others are not. Of course, we don't say this to boast, but to share the truth of who we are with those who believe in Jesus, and those who are still unsure. I have found that the simple fact opens the eyes of those who don't have a good understanding of early Christianity. For those inmates, who are not able to fully communicate the history of the church, the simple concept that the Catholic church alone was founded by Jesus is an easy way to bring people toward the fullness of the truth.

Dear C.G., Congratulations! You have served your time and are soon to be going home. We are happy to have contributed to your return to God and His church. Yes, the Catholic church is the only church founded by Christ Himself while other churches have been founded by human beings. In the gospel of Matthew 16:18, Jesus said "And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church..." St. Peter's original name was Simon. Jesus changed his name to Peter, which in Aramaic means stone or rock. Jesus established His church by giving Peter and the Apostles the power to forgive or retain sin, the power to

change bread and wine into His own body and blood, and the custody of the teachings of Christ and the authority to interpret these teachings through the Holy Spirit. No other church can make these claims.

As you go out into the world, stay strong in your faith, and continue to study God's Word. We also encourage you to go to your local Catholic Church and receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation and attend Mass every Sunday. Since becoming closer to God, the anger I have had has left me. The blame I put on myself for not being there for my daughter has left me. I have a relationship with her and converse and show each other love. I thank you for helping bring me closer to Our Lord Jesus Christ. Your brother-in-Christ, E.A.

Dear E.A.., God bless your open heart! God knows all our hearts in every detail. You call it a blessing the day you entered prison. You were right about paying for what you did. Read Matt. 5:25-26, "Amen, I say to you, you will not be released until you have paid the last penny."

The beauty of all this is God's Divine Love and Mercy. As humans we look at outward appearances, but the Lord looks into our hearts. **1 Samuel 16:7**

God says, "I will remember your sins no more." Jeremiah 31:34 Jesus will not hold our sins against us. "For I will forgive their evil doing and remember their sins no more" Hebrews 8:12.

Look at what our Lord has taught you in the past 15 years! Your faith has been rekindled, it's alive and on fire! God rewards those who seek Him. In Hebrews 11:6 "No one can please God without faith, for whoever comes to God Must have Faith that God exists and rewards those who seek Him." Why do people pray to Mary and the Saints?

The fullness of the faith subsists in the Catholic Church. You can present these ideas to non-Catholics, but they may not understand them, and therefore continue to reject them.

We belong to the body of Christ and have the communion of saints: those souls already in **heaven**, those in **purgatory** on their way to heaven, and those of us on **earth**.

The Holy Bible teaches us that WORSHIP belongs to God alone. But in our communion of saints, we PRAY to, for, and with one another, to intercede for the needs of each one of us to God. To pray means to ask. Only God can grant anything that is good, so we all pray to Him. I pray for others as one of the saints, the holy ones of which the Bible speaks, on earth. I ask God to grant others what they

When we pray to the saints in **heaven**, we are asking them to join us in asking God to grant our needs, and they delight in that, bringing our needs to Jesus who can grant all things. As Catholics in our worship services, we do allow anyone to join us either in prayer or just to attend, but Only Catholics may receive Holy Communion.

THE CHURCHES DEDICATION FOR

MARCH: The **Solemnity of St. Joseph** is a special landmark this month in which we will celebrate the great honor bestowed upon the foster father of Jesus. Also, the Solemnity of the Annunciation (March 25) when we ponder Our Lady's fiat.

The entire month of March falls during the liturgical season of Lent which is represented by the liturgical color violet or purple - a symbol of penance, mortification, and the sorrow of a contrite heart.

A Few FEAST DAYS:

<u>March 17th – St. Patrick</u> – Patron: of Ireland, died in 461. <u>March 19th – St. Joseph</u>, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary

March 25th – Annunciation of the Lord

March 25th – St. Dismas was the so-called "Good Thief" who was crucified along with another thief and Jesus on the hill called Golgotha on the outskirts of Jerusalem. Writing centuries apart, two Church Fathers, Tertullian and Augustine, claimed that the three died on March 25, the date that was designated as Dismas's Feast Day.

The Gospel of Luke relates Jesus' conversation with the two thieves... Jesus is taunted by one thief, who challenges Jesus, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us." Luke 23:39 But the other thief ...acknowledges that Jesus is the Messiah, by saying to Him, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." ST. DISMAS IS THE PATRON SAINT of Prisoners, Repentant Criminals – murderers, thieves, prostitutes, and those condemned to death.

THE CHURCHES DEDICATION FOR

APRIL: is to the Eucharist and to the Holy Spirit. This tradition has developed because Easter Sunday often falls in April, ...and during the Easter celebration we remember the Eucharistic sacrifice Christ gave us and the Baptism in the Holy Spirit, which would come after Jesus's resurrection.



A Few FEAST DAYS:

April 6th, 7th, 8th - Sacred Triduum - The last three days of Holy Week are

referred to as the Easter or Sacred Triduum, the three-part drama of Christ's redemption: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday.

<u>April 9th - Easter Sunday</u> - Easter is the Feast of Feasts, the complete and unreserved joy and gladness of all Christians.

<u>April 16th – Divine Mercy Sunday</u> – The Feast was recorded in the diary of St. Faustina granting the biggest promise of Grace from the Devotion of Divine Mercy. On this day, "The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment." (*Diary*, 699)

<u>April 23rd – St. George</u> – Patron: archers; butchers; farmers; field workers; soldiers; leprosy; plague; skin diseases; herpes; syphilis.

<u>April 25th – St. Mark</u> – Patron: Against impenitence; attorneys; Egypt; glaziers; prisoners; Venice, Italy.

<u>April 29th – St. Catherine of Siena</u> – Patron: bodily ills; fire prevention; firefighters; illness; miscarriages; nurses; sexual temptation; sick people; temptations.
