TESTIMONY

Dear St. Dismas Guild, I wish to say thank you for all the help, support and prayer you have given me over the past two years. For the longest time I had been totally lost. My life was just aimlessly going by. I had allowed the devil to find a place in me. I thought I was at my lowest. I ended up in prison. But I truly found that I was not alone. The Lord was with me. When I was released, I was so sure I was full of the Spirit, that I would do great things. Feed the hungry and house the homeless.

Then one cold March day as I was returning to my apartment from the parole office I was all excited about the plans I had for a homeless shelter, when the Lord spoke to me, "You cannot help others until you first help yourself." I had no job, I was on government assistance, and I was not attending Mass on a regular basis.

I <u>heard</u> the Lord, but I did not <u>LISTEN</u> to Him. I know the difference between the two. Hearing is but a mechanical function of the human body. Listening requires a commitment of the heart, a commitment to do the right thing. And, yet, I returned to my previous life. For twelve years my life kept going. I lived a lonely, isolated existence. I had no contact with my family. I became angry and cynical. I was blaming God for all my trouble. Then, one day there was a knock on my door. A team of heavily armed federal agents was there to arrest me.

Now two years later I sit in pretrial detention. During that time, **I had come to <u>LISTEN</u> to the Lord.** I was blessed to find many Catholic books such as the "Imitation of Christ" in the detention center library, and the Dismas Guild. You sent me a rosary, bible, bible study and prayer cards. I began to pray the Rosary on a daily basis.

I was unable to receive the sacraments due to Covid. And the facility chaplain with a bias against Catholic volunteers did not allow them. What was I to do? I was blessed that on Sunday mornings a local television station aired Catholic mass. I wrote for their worship aide and participated in making a spiritual communion.

With my court case now concluded, I go for sentencing in two days. I have been told that I have the toughest judge in

this district. I have been praying, not for a lenient sentence, just for a just one. I know it is now time to render unto Caesar that which is Caesars, and unto God that which is Gods. I may never leave prison. I am getting up there in age. I am okay with that. For His will be done. My body may be locked up behind high walls and barbed wire, but my spirit will always be free. And the freedom of spirituality is more fruitful than any kind of earthly freedom. After I am sentenced, I will be transferred to a federal prison. As such, I will not be able to take any of my property. No prayer books, bible, rosary. However, wherever I end up I know I will have access at least to a bible and a rosary. Yours in Christ, J.R.

Dear J.R., God loves you with an everlasting love. Jeremiah 31:3 Your attitude is that of Christ when you were unable to receive the Eucharist while in jail and went searching. It was the Holy Spirit who motivated you to search for a way to receive spiritual communion.

It is so easy to return to your previous life when you leave jail if you get into the same environment. When you leave behind the old self and put on the new self, made in the image of God and sealed with the grace of God at your Baptism, you follow God's lead and get into a Church and hang around with those who obey God's commandment to love Him and love others. Keep praying for a lenient sentence for God answers all your prayers in the way He sees fit. He sees your heart; we look at appearances. A heart that loves God will obey His commandments. Deuteronomy 7:9-10 says, "Understand, then, that the Lord, your God, is God indeed, the faithful God who keeps His merciful covenant down to the thousandth generation toward those who love him and keep his commandments, but who repays with destruction a person who hates him; He does not delay with such a one but makes them personally pay for it."

Yes, J.R., keep praying for a just sentence because we have a just God who loves you and yearns for you to do things His way not your way. If you spend the rest of your life in prison the Spirit of God will comfort you and help you to love those who you encounter. "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort." 2 Corinthians 1:3

A young woman came up to me and said, "Chaplain, I would like to receive Christ into my life." I said to her then, "Listen to what our friend who is singing has to say." This young woman came up to me again and said, "I need to be obedient to Jesus' will." I shared with her that Jesus wants everything for us that is good. I urge you, If you have a special gift like this dedicated Christian woman, please use it in your community. Someone needs you to help in a jail, hospital or center nearby.

SPIRITUAL DIRECTION w/Fr. Richard

I was told that Jesus Christ was only a man that could see God in all things. Is that correct?

People say many things that are not true, rather that are their own opinions coming from ignorance or from malice. They have no authority of truth, so it is important not to trust in their words.

God is the authority for truth and for belief. He has revealed Himself and His Truth in salvation history, recorded in the Holy Bible and the Tradition of the Holy Catholic Church.

I remember Deacon Ken saying many years ago that he would tell the inmates he talked to who were just coming into the prison to do your time alone, do what you are told and keep quiet. Doing the Bread of Life alone asking the Holy Spirit to teach me and remind me of all Jesus said and did has helped me to develop a personal relationship with Jesus.

When Deacon Ken was alive, he had his time, and I had my time and when we came together, we shared our time we had with Jesus. This is what made us one heart and one mind, for the Holy Spirit taught us the love of God. As we received the love of God, we were able to love more and more like Jesus by dying to ourselves for the love of the other; we would pick up our cross and follow Him. We had fifty-three years of learning how to become one body, soul, and mind, by doing our time alone with Jesus.
