TESTIMONY

Personal question answered from the Bread of Life Bible Study... What is the testimony of the Lord you have to share? Do you have a personal testimony of how God has worked in your life? Have you shared this with your family and friends? Pray and ask God to reveal to you your own personal testimony this week. (Cycle A, pg. 96)

God called me out of darkness and into His wonderful light, from the sins of abortion, fornication, drugs, and alcohol at the age of 28 through the beautiful Art I studied in college of the Virgin Mary, especially the Annunciation images. I fell in love with her, and remember thinking, Jesus would have had a mother, wouldn't He? Soon after, she began leading me to her son Jesus, through Baptism, Confirmation, the Catholic Church, and my husband.

1/3 Where was God in your Life, Child/Teenage years? - I lived with my grandmother the first 7 years of my life and she took us to her Baptist church, and I enjoyed God's love. But in my teens, after her death, I fell away, and God was not allowed in my life. At 17 I had my first abortion because the adults in my life told me what to do. At 23 I had another abortion because I thought well this seems wrong, but it's legal and I've done this before, so I went ahead. Little did I know the destruction that would follow. I fell into a deep depression, drugs, and alcohol, etc. I could have easily ended up in prison or dead.

1/3 How did Christ change your life? - Mother Mary heard my pleas for help and maybe she knew that I wanted nothing to do with God, so she led me ever so gently in the right direction. I began seeking help from counselors about my dysfunctional family and destructive past and started attending Al-anon meetings that met at a Catholic Church. I could acknowledge "a power greater than myself," but I couldn't say God, so accepting "Higher Power" was okay for me at the time. I started feeling better and soon after met my husband to be who was a fallen away Catholic. We talked about many things and our Spirituality seemed important to both of us. He began explaining all things Catholic to me and it all seemed like The Truth, and I wanted more. I enrolled in the RCIA classes at the parish that was next to

my university campus, and he began to come with me. I soon realized I had never been baptized and could be forgiven of all my horrible sins and get a fresh start on life. I was Baptized at the Easter Vigil 1988 March 25th, the Feast of the Annunciation and St. Dismas.

1/3 How is God working in your life now? – By the Grace of God, I wake up each day and thank Him for another day to Live, Learn and Love... I say my prayers throughout the day, especially the Rosary, and make sure to attend mass each Sunday and other days during the week, along with adoration when I'm able. I thoroughly enjoy reading the daily readings and reflections from Word Among Us and DailyScripture.net and share my art photography on social media along with a scripture verse or prayer that I learned for the day. I also love completing the Bread of Life Catholic Bible Study and being prepared for mass each Sunday. I also try to get to monthly confession, and yearly retreats if possible. Once I realized how much God had forgiven the sins of my past, and how much He loves me, I knew that a personal relationship with Him was what I needed to stay close to Him and away from the sinful life I was leading all those years ago. My favorite verse has become, "So I tell you, her many sins have been forgiven; hence, she has shown great love. But the one to whom little is forgiven, loves little." Living with your grandmother the first 7 years of your life, taking you to her Baptist church, you enjoyed God's Love. It seems like you experienced His Love for you through the Word of God in those formative years. Your love for art and falling in love with Mary through the images of her lead you to Jesus. It seems like you needed a woman to lead you there. Your mom didn't raise you well, so our Blessed Mother touched your heart and led you to her Son. I can see how she stepped in and became a mother to you. Every child needs a mother's love. Our Lord protected you from ending up in prison or dead from the lifestyle you

were living. So many are in prison now because of drugs. For people that know you now would never have guessed you went through abortions, drugs & pre-marital sex. You are now, through the grace of God and choosing to cooperate with the Holy Spirit, being obedient to the Word of God and becoming more like the Virgin Mary each day. God bless you S.S., your obedience and purity will bring many to Jesus. "I have set before you life and death, the blessing and the curse.
