TESTIMONY

To Whom it May Concern, hello, my name is W.C. and I am currently incarcerated. I was attending our Catholic service and saw a newsletter on our table. I picked it up and read it a couple days later. It was your September 2023 issue. I found it very interesting and inspiring to hear other prisoners' stories, especially the letter from J.J. points of his story seem reflected in mine.

I was not a religious person growing up. Both my parents were Catholic, but my dad was divorced and the church at that time was reluctant to baptize me when I was born, and my parents stepped away from regularly attending church. When I was 13, I was Baptized, given First Communion and Confirmed on Easter. After a year or so of attending regularly I, as a teenager, was given a choice and decided to stop attending.

Over the years I made some bad choices and let myself go down paths that led me to serving a 15-year sentence. While my legal issues were in pretrial phase I started attending church regularly during the nine months I was at a halfway house. At first it started out as just an excuse to get out of the house I was forced to be in if I wasn't working. The more I attended though, the more I realized that Jesus was guiding me back to Him and a state of grace. I found myself really reflecting on the decisions and actions that led to my criminal issues and really wanting to change. I have started that process and am still on that journey to become a good Christian and follower of Jesus. It is a struggle at times, but I find each day I try and each time I remind myself I am not alone on this road it becomes easier. I am now spending time daily in prayer and trying to take time every day to read the bible (even if it is only a chapter a day.)

I asked my mom and Uncle (who happens to be a Catholic Priest) to see if they could find me a Bible study by correspondence. Then the next week I found your newsletter. If that isn't a sign, I'm not sure what is! So, I would like to request more information on your bible study

program or, if you want, to just send the workbook. This is all new to me. I have been down since (date). I have found great comfort in His Word and am excited to continue to grow my faith and strengthen my understanding of my relationship with Jesus. If I could get on your mailing list for your monthly newsletter, that would be nice too. Also, in the September letter you mentioned two books available. If the booklet "The Book on Forgiveness" talks about forgiving yourself, I would be very interested in that. Otherwise, the other book "Speak the Truth in Love" would be fine too. Thank you for all your organization does. Being on this side of the fence can be difficult, but knowing others out there care to take time and money to help us means a lot. Thank you and God Bless. Dear WC, it is the Good Shepherd that brought you back. You're right He was guiding you back to Himself. He is always looking for strays. We sent you Cycle B of the Bread of Life Catholic Bible Study workbook. This is a simple bible study that draws you into a relationship with the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. As you do the study talk to God and build your relationship with Him.

I know this Christmas time must make you feel sad being locked up away from your family and friends. So glad you find great comfort in the Word. "Cast all your cares on Him because He cares for you." QUESTION ABOUT THE BOOK of Revelation and rapture?

The book of Revelation is in the style of apocalyptic writing, fantastic imagery to sustain the communities during a time of crisis. The warnings to the 7 churches in Asia minor to reform are followed by images of heaven, of

retribution against her enemies, and the coming of Jesus and the new Jerusalem.

Your jailhouse preachers teach what they know regarding Jesus' second coming from 1 Thessalonians 4 the dead will arise first, and then anyone left alive will be taken up by Jesus. Rapture is a word used to describe this event.


Since Jesus said, even He did not know the hour, He taught us to be ready for His coming. 1) Baptism by water and the Holy Spirit (John 3:5f), 2) Jesus command that we eat His flesh and drink His blood to have eternal life and to be raised on the last day (John 6:51-58), and 3) that we do the Father's Will so that Jesus and the Father make their home in us (John 14:23) which is obeying the commandments, worshiping, and being charitable. This will allow us to be raised from the dead or taken up if we are still alive when Jesus comes.
