That depends on how much closer I follow the Word of God that I discover by doing the Bible Study you provide so faithfully.

When I was younger, I was in love with Christ and our Holy Mother Church. As a boy, the Mass was in Latin and music was Gregorian Chants among others. I lived for no other reason than to worship God and follow the tenets of the Catholic Church. Now, I can't believe I could exist in here without Christ. He is my life; my love and everything and every way I find meaning. If I hadn't found Christ in here (like He was lost) I would have nothing but death, the grave, and Hell. I'm now in a wonderful place with Christ by my side, even those times when He's carrying me. I wouldn't trade what I have in here with anyone or anything. I'm blessed, although sometimes it's hard to tell. I remember something St. Theresa of Avila said at prayer, "If this is the way you treat your friends, Lord, no wonder you have so few."

Now that I'm getting older, the body pains persist, but I offer them up for those souls whose needs are great in Purgatory, and other intentions. So that's my story and I'm sticking to it. **May the Lord bless, protect, comfort, and**
