H.G., Blessings to you too. You are very welcome for receiving the Spanish Bread of Life. Your perseverance is to be commended, and the Lord is very pleased with you. You hang in there and you will be rewarded as you continue to come to know Jesus. I think you may have found it difficult at first because this bible study is different from others in the fact it is to help you come into a personal relationship with God (besides having some of what we call "head" knowledge). The focus is on relationships, which encounter the heart. Each question helps you come to know God, the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.

Once you come into a deep love for Jesus, you will come to know the love of the Father and the Holy Spirit, the Trinity. The message is simple: God loves you unconditionally and when you receive that love you will be able to love others. The Mass is God's love manifested through the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Jesus suffered and died taking all our sins on Himself so we could be free from sin, sickness and death. Keep persevering H.G. and pick up your cross every day. "If a man wishes to come after me, he must deny himself, take up his cross and begin to follow in my footsteps." DEACON KEN'S CORNER

A MAN CAME RUNNING ACROSS THE STREET, yelling at the top of his lungs, "Chaplain, it's me..., don't you remember?" I looked at him for a moment and then we

hugged and shook hands warmly and stood there on the sidewalk talking about Jesus, family, and jail. He had just completed a three-year sentence in state prison and was back in town.

He told me that in state prison, drugs, sex and alcohol we're available if you had the money. He told me that the healing power of Jesus had kept him from being destroyed and that he was now a committed man of God's word. He then started to quiver and almost cry, because his wife fell back into drugs while he was doing time. We both prayed for her then and will continue to pray for her on her own trip through hell. He will be going back to prison for another crime, so I ask you to keep him in your prayers. I read to him a message from scripture (Lamentations 3:40) "let us search our ways and turn again to the Lord." Their children will remain in a foster home until the situation of the parents is resolved.

SPIRITUAL DIRECTION w/Fr. Richard

ANGER IS A HUMAN EMOTION that arises in us to push away something we experience as threatening at that moment. It is not sinful. The emotion of anger, however, can block our reason in the mind, and can overwhelm our soul at that moment.

The expression of the anger by using violence in speech and action is called "ire" which is sinful. Ire is the expression that punishes or silences the other. Sometimes, however, the better choice may be to defend yourself if threats to life and limb are present as I am told happens in prison.

Certainly, anger management classes can help. It may be the better choice to avoid violence in speech and action until the anger subsides. When a Christian is alone with the Holy Spirit, he can bring to God the anger and the situation for God's care of the soul, and later express what needs to be said. 1 Peter 3:14-16 is a guide for me, "But even if you should suffer because of righteousness, blessed are you. Do not be afraid or terrified with fear of them but sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts. Always be ready to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope but do it with gentleness and reverence, keeping your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who defame your good conduct in Christ may themselves be put to shame."

Wherever Christians are is their church. In danger of death and no priest available, you should baptize a non-Christian with water over the head and the formula, "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit" (Matthew 28:19).

Confession to God directly may be the only way you can express your sorrow for sin. This is good and acceptable, until you can do so in the Sacrament of Penance when a priest visits you.
