TESTIMONY

Dear St. Dismas Guild,

My name is I. M. I've known of God the Father and Jesus my whole life, being baptized as a child. However, life broke my family apart and I was kidnapped at 3.5 years old by my own father, then smuggled into California. I wouldn't see my mother until I was 17 years old.

While living with my father, I was abused by my stepmother, sexually abused, and suffered neglect and abandonment due to my father's addiction. I grew up going to Catholic Mass as well as a protestant church. I would eventually walk away from God altogether and commit myself to gangs. I lived in this destructive life for many years. I experienced many hardships and committed very calloused acts towards people. I used all drugs to help me get through all of this. While my life seems very dark, there was a light in my life God made sure of that. While in prison, I always found myself speaking to Priests or Deacons. They always encouraged me to do better. Fr. M.K., S.J. would eventually be there for me and his love and encouragement was the way I would eventually see how much God loved me.

Today, I no longer use drugs or am a gang member. I attend Mass regularly and was recently confirmed into the Catholic Church. My witness was a gift from God—it was a prominent politician from California. I also put together a hygiene drive in prison. We collected soap, shampoo, toothpaste, and laundry detergent, and donated all of it to the Homeless Day Center. God's love and the encouragement of all those God sent to my life has been a blessing. Since answering God's call, my life has not been the same.

Dear I.M., Those first seven years of your life determine a lot about your character, especially if you have not heard the words "I love you" from your parents or grandparents. It sounds like you had a rough beginning. God can restore what the locust has eaten (Joel 2:25). God can restore those lost childhood years. As you come to know your real Father, you begin to see how loveable you are and how much you are loved by Him. It takes forgiveness of your biological dad or anyone else that has hurt you. Forgiveness is a decision, and as you decide to forgive by saying the words, you allow God's love to come in. God loves His children so much He laid down His life for them. The Priest or Deacons who came into your life were encouragers for you. Attending Mass regularly and receiving the Body of Christ will strengthen you to stop looking behind and to what is ahead. Jesus is leading you and holding onto your right hand. Keep your eyes on Him and listen to what He says and observe how He acts then you will be healed of the scars of your past. Get to know Jesus through the bible study we sent you and have the same attitude as His. Philippians 2:5 says, "Have among yourselves the same attitude that is also yours in Christ Jesus." You are doing a great job I.M. serving others. That's what Jesus did. Keep up the good work. God bless you and Happy New

I started to say thank you and then this man who was waiting to leave our facility and go to another prison to serve a life term said, "Don't worry about anything and pray about everything." Then he took my little vile of holy oil and began to give me a blessing. He called upon the Lord to give me the gift of patience, courage, and joy. I share this with you, because this man has been called a "monster" because of his crime and yet, here he was even after being sentenced, giving praise and glory to the Lord. His eyes glistened, and he had trouble keeping back the tears as we talked about his eight-year-old boy and his four-and six-year-old girls. He was a man getting ready to serve for 20 years to life sentence, and his faith in Jesus Christ was giving him the strength he needed at this time to even minister to me.

MARIE'S REFLECTIONS

Good morning, Lord, I have come to know you through your all-powerful Word. Paul is telling me that we who worship through the Spirit of God, who boast in Christ Jesus and do not put our confidence in flesh, although he himself had grounds for confidence even in the flesh. In zeal he persecuted the Church, in righteousness (based on the law) he was blameless. He considers everything as a loss because of the supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus the Lord. I know you from what you tell me in your words. Lord, everything you say comes from your gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. I have come to know you through the gospels and the writings of others in the bible. It has every answer for me. Thank you for your all-powerful words. The simple message is to come to know you through the Word, to love you with all my heart, all my mind, all my soul, all my strength and love others the way you love me. You love me unconditionally.

You have taught me that through your Word. I can't understand it but through the grace you give me to know, love, and serve you. My heart rejoices searching for you and when I find you, I praise you and absorb your love for me. I rejoice in seeking you and I look to you in your strength; I seek to serve you constantly. I recall the wondrous deeds that you have wrought. I am your chosen one. You are my God. You tell me to come to you, all you who labor and are burdened, and you will give me rest, says the Lord. Sometimes I cannot find my sin. Am I righteous or a Pharisee, or a Scribe. What am I Lord? You tell me to come to you. Here I am Lord. I feel you here with me even though I am crying. I cry a lot for you and when I do I feel your love for me, your unconditional love. Why am I crying and not joyful Lord? You tell me there will be rejoicing among the angels of God over one sinner who repents. You are telling me my tears are over those who have not turned to you. MESSAGE FROM SDG DIRECTOR

In the news: San Francisco Archdiocese provides Thanksgiving meals to 1,200 incarcerated persons (McKenna Snow November 25, 2024). Volunteers with the Archdiocese helped deliver meals and handwritten cards on Nov. 21st at local county jails. Two chaplains also came and offered prayers of Thanksgiving. Julio Escobar, the justice Archdiocese's restorative coordinator, spearheaded the now- annual initiative of bringing Thanksgiving meals and providing cards to incarcerated persons during the holidays.

"Bringing this special meal... makes a difference and [lets] them know that they are loved by God, and that they have dignity as human beings, despite the mistakes that they have done," Escobar told Catholic Vote in a Nov. 22 interview.

In other news, on December 26, 2024, Pope Francis will open The Holy Door in the Rebibbia Prison of Rome (which symbolizes not just this penitentiary, but all prisons worldwide) for the 2025 jubilee year.
