My whole life, all I've ever wanted was to be accepted and truly belong (which is why I made some very bad choices). I grew up in a broken home and was passed from one family member to the next, so every time I turned around I was faced with new social and familial challenges. Trying to fit in, trying to stand out. Trying to be okay and comfortable in my own skin (which sadly, I wasn't and haven't been until recently). So here I am 8, 9, 10... years old thinking "if I were more like this person of this family or that person of that family, maybe I won't be passed around anymore."

So, I started to adopt different characteristics from different people thinking that I would finally be accepted for who I was. All the while I did not realize that I can't be anyone but who God made me to be. I've sought acceptance from siblings, family on both my mother's and father's side, gangs, drug dealers/addicts, and women. Every person with whom I have had a relationship, never gave me the completion that I now feel by being a part of the most loving and accepting family (not to mention largest) that I've ever encountered. **By God's grace, I have finally found my home. Thank you for being part of my family and accepting me as part of yours. I can finally just be me!** And who knows, maybe now someone will aspire to be like me.

Many blessings to you R.C.! Thank you for sharing your journey in finding Christ in your life. Life can be very challenging when you don't feel loved or accepted. Especially like you, being brought up in a broken home where neither of your parents even knew how to love you. The definition of acceptance is, "the act of embracing others as they are, offering love, forgiveness and grace." So like you, striving to find love in all the wrong places, you tried to fit in with people who accepted you for who you were, only to find out, in reality, they wanted you to be who they were, so as to fit in and to belong. In doing so, losing your own identity even more.

All along the way. Jesus was right beside you like the poem "Footprints." It was Jesus who carried you through all those rough roads, trying to redirect your walks of life and challenging situations. Isaiah 40:29-31 ''He strengthens those who are weak and tired. Even those who are young grow weak. Young people can fall exhausted. But those who trust in the Lord for help, will find their strength renewed. They will rise on wings like eagles, they will run and not get weary, they will walk and not grow weak.'' Even though you have suffered the consequences because of your wrong choices, Jesus knows that, and He also knows your heart and what you're capable of. I don't blame God for putting me here, as we have free will and I was making bad choices using beer, liquor, and prescription drugs, Vicodin. Though no one knows the future, I pray that I never ever drink again or use any kind of drug, prescription or not! I love the Lord God and He knows best- He loves His creation and those that want to follow His ways and commandments. God is good. Worship God alone. Thank you, God bless, I.C.

#### "BE NOT AFRAID..."

Frank said, "Chaplain I know that the Lord wants to use me to spread HIS word, even here in jail and I'm not afraid." Frank then went out from his holding cell into the courtroom and heard the judge sentence him to 26 years to life for firstdegree murder. That night Frank and I prayed that the Lord would indeed bless him and his response to God 's word. Frank again said to me, "Chaplain I am not afraid because I have put my life into the Lord's hand. wherever HE leads me I will follow."

I believe Frank. My prayers will be with him and his family wherever he is sent to pay for his crime.

#### A Few FEAST DAYS:

*Feb.*  $2^{nd}$  – <u>Presentation of the Lord</u> – "occurs forty days after the birth of Jesus and is also known as Candlemas day, since the blessing and procession of candles is included in today's liturgy."

*Feb.* 8<sup>th</sup> – <u>St. Josephine Bakhita</u> – "Saint Josephine was a young Sudanese girl sold into slavery and brought to Italy. There she was baptized, and, having reached majority age, was granted her freedom by Italian law. She died after a long and painful illness, during which she would cry out to the Lord: "Please loosen the chains... they are so heavy!" Her dying words were "Our Lady! Our Lady!"

*Feb.* 11<sup>th</sup> – <u>Our Lady of Lourdes</u> – "Today marks the first apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary in 1858 to fourteenyear-old Marie Bernadette (St. Bernadette) Soubirous. Between February 11 and July 16, 1858, the Blessed Virgin appeared eighteen times and showed herself to St. Bernadette in the hollow of the rock at Lourdes."
