

DOING TIME WITH JESUS

My name is T.S., I was recently released from incarceration at the San Bernardino County High Desert Detention Center. I am proud to give thanks to God for bringing me through such a potentially dark time in my life. This time has caused much destruction. But glory to God, He has shone light wherever He leads me, and I look back on the blessings. I accepted each day in the detention center as a day in God's field. Where Jesus says that the harvest is plenty, but the laborers are few, I heard my calling (Matthew 9:35-38). I hope that the lives I touched are impacted toward their relationship with our Heavenly Father. However, to be honest, I did continually ask that this season of harvest might be done and that I be allowed to go home. I am grateful that due to changes in circumstances, at an unexpected time, I was released from over a year of incarceration. My situation is not complete though and there is still a journey ahead, so please do pray for my family as there is much healing that I hope for.

I would like to thank everyone at the St. Dismas Guild Prison Ministry. Your work in supporting those in need is a blessing. I first came across your ministry's information through a friend in the dorm who had a list of ministries from the chaplain. I looked through the list and saw "Catholic Bibles"! I was excited to write and within a few weeks I received an NAB study Bible with footnotes, and historical references, it was perfect for the studies I was working on. About a month later I met a young man who'd just gotten arrested. He wanted to learn about the Bible, so I sat with him, and we read each day.

He was able to post bail within a few days but before leaving I asked if he had a Bible at home and he said no, so I sent him home with mine. I had other versions for myself, but that was my only Catholic Bible. A few months later I came across an order form from the St. Dismas Guild, for Bibles, pamphlets, etc. I thought that I'd give it a shot to see if I can get a new Bible and a catechism, and again I was so stoked within a few weeks when they were both delivered. Thank you so much, each of you working with the ministry, your efforts are as crucial as they are effective. The love that you show for those in need is showing those in need the love of God. Please keep up your wonderful work, and may God bless you and your families. Respectfully, T.S.

It is great T.S. you are looking back at the blessings and not the negative things in your life. The Holy Spirit is leading you to bring others to Himself. He has put that desire in your heart to spread the Good News of salvation to the lost, the drug addict, the prostitute, the drunk, the murderer, the thief, the self-righteous, the pedophile, the sinner. Jesus' love was demonstrated by what He did by His death on the cross, the innocent one, in obedience to His Father, Our Father.

Deacon Ken had that love for prisoners, the love of Jesus Christ, as the Holy Spirit moved in him to draw the sinner to repentance. Your excitement in receiving the bible to learn more about the God who is love was motivated by the Holy Spirit. Learning about the God who loves you and motivates you to do good and turn away from evil, who heals you from all the false accusations and malicious speech will give you the desire of your heart. The healing you are hoping for will take place because of your desire that all you touched be drawn to our heavenly Father. All in God's timing. His timing is perfect. When you're locked up, one of the virtues God teaches us is patience and love is patient and kind as 1 Corinthians 13:8 tells us. Read 1 Corinthians 13 in its entirety, as it defines what Love is and what it is not. We should all take time to reflect on this passage,

inviting the Holy Spirit to reveal to us the true nature of Love – both its qualities and its absence.

God bless you, T.S.. May the Lord help you see the stinkin thinkin (Deacon Ken's spelling) in your life and continue to motivate you to **make disciples of all the nations** under the headship of the Church (**Matthew 28:16-20**). We are sending you a new Bible and a Prayer Book.

SPIRITUAL DIRECTION w/Fr. Richard *THE NEED FOR BAPTISM AND CONTINUOUS CONVERSION:*

In man's creation, he is wounded by original sin and is not destined for heaven yet because of this. Original sin separates us from God. Baptism cleanses man from this and orients him toward God. It is the BEGINNING of the way to heaven. Everyone does not cooperate with God's grace; some choose evil and thus are not equal in saving grace because of the life they have chosen, despite the saving grace received in Baptism. For this reason, we must seek to be continuously converted by God's saving grace. One way we can do this is by making frequent, honest visits to the Sacrament of Reconciliation, with the firm desire to sin no more. St. Paul speaks about this need for continuous conversion after Baptism in Romans 6:1-4 - "What then shall we say? Shall we persist in sin that grace may abound? Of course not! How can we who died to sin yet live in it? Or are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? We were indeed buried with Him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life."

LETTER FROM THE LATE DEACON KEN FINN DATED, March 1985.

Easter is a time to celebrate the Risen Lord; risen from the dead, conquered death and because of Him you and I can face tomorrow without fear. He died and rose from the dead so that you and I could die and rise from the dead also. We can celebrate at this Easter time the incredible victory that Jesus Christ has won for us. We are really "Easter people" or "risen people" — all we have to do is say, "Yes Lord." He has paid the ransom for our sins, and we are free, even if we are behind bars in some far-off prison. We ask, "Wow, what will it cost?" And the answer is our yielding our hearts and minds to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Jesus' gift to us is our faith and we really need to ask: what is faith? Faith is the loving response to the power and presence of God in your life. Faith calls for a response from you and me, to really be effective. I pray that this Easter season you will say to our Lord and Savior. Yes Lord, I thank You for dying for me, a worthless sinner. I thank You for rising from the dead for me, so that I can live forever too. I respond to Your gift of faith to me with my own "yes Lord" which will be reflected in the actions of my life. This is a prayer that will come alive as we really experience the risen Lord in our own personal life. Happy Easter!

<u>A Few FEAST DAYS:</u>

<u>April 20th – Easter Sunday</u> – Easter Sunday is the greatest of all Sundays and the most important of all liturgical times for Catholics. It celebrates the Lord's resurrection from the dead, culminating in



His Ascension to the Father and sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church.

<u>April 25th – St. Mark</u> – Patron: Against impenitence; attorneys; barristers; captives; Egypt; glaziers; imprisoned people; insect bites; lions; notaries; prisoners; scrofulous diseases; Venice, Italy.

<u>April 27th – Divine Mercy Sunday</u> – The Feast of Divine Mercy was recorded in the diary of St. Faustina granting the biggest promise of Grace from the Devotion of Divine Mercy. On this day, all who receive communion may obtain total forgiveness of all sins, meaning that the person would go directly to heaven without suffering in purgatory. Plenary indulgences are granted by the Catholic Church by reciting certain simple prayers.

<u>April 29th – St. Catherine of Siena</u> – Patron: bodily ills; fire prevention; firefighters; illness; miscarriages; nurses; people ridiculed for their piety; sexual temptation; sick people; temptations. ~ catholicculture.org
