DOING TIME WITH JESUS

Hello, my name is T.Z., and I am an inmate in Ohio. I was raised as a Catholic as a child and walked away from the Church at 17 to explore other faiths. I am now 48 and have come back to Catholicism since we had a special Christmas Mass in 2024. I have been going through RCIA and a few other Catholic programs here in the facility on a daily basis, including weekly Mass. Since returning to my Catholic roots, I have never felt better. I am relearning about the faith as well. A few changes have happened since I have left and returned, but I am picking up on them. I just recently came upon your organization and discovered you help with Catholic books and materials for those who are not able to afford them. I earn \$20 per month here as a student and dog trainer/handler. The courts automatically take \$10 per month for fines and costs.

I am hoping to acquire three books to keep me on my Catholic journey: an up-to-date rosary warfare book, a "Daily Roman Missal," and a nice Catholic Study Bible. I am not sure if any of these or all would be available to ask for and receive, but, if at all possible, I would be so grateful for them. I am working on getting a Rosary. The only outside help I have for anything is my fiancé, and she is living strictly off of her tax return. Since she had to leave her last job in order to work at being able to have her knee replacement done. If she did not have to go through all of this, she would go onto Amazon to order these books for me. This is the reason I am reaching out to you and asking for these materials. Again, I would be really grateful for the help. I thank you in advance, and may God bless you, your family, and your organization. Sincerely Yours in Christ Jesus, T.Z.

Dear T.Z. Jesus said in John 3:5, "Amen, Amen, I say to you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless he is born of water and the Spirit." We are so happy to hear you are coming back to your roots, which probably included Baptism as a baby. What you did not understand when you were young you are now learning in RCIA classes and other sources. Not understanding who the Holy Spirit is has been difficult for many as they get older and leave the church. You can develop

a great testimony by sharing how God touched your life. We would love for you to write back to us telling us where the Lord was in your life for those 17 years, and where the Lord was in your life when you left exploring other faiths. Let us know how you came into repentance and now while in prison, are coming back into the Church. God has brought you full circle. He has been with you all these years directing you and protecting you, but sin blocked you from hearing His voice. John 14:26 says, "The Paraclete, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will instruct you in everything, and remind you of all I have told you." "In the quiet of your mind, listen for the voice of God who loves you with an everlasting love." (Jeremiah 31:3) Hope to hear back from you with your testimony on how God has worked in your life. Please limit it to 500 words. We are praying for you. "The fruit of Baptism, or baptismal grace, is a rich reality that includes forgiveness of original sin and all personal sins, birth into the new life by which man becomes an adoptive son of the Father, a member of Christ and a temple of the Holy Spirit." (CCC1279) Additionally, we do not have a "Rosary Warfare Book," but we do have a Prayer Book that has the Rosary prayers in it. We can also send you a pro-life Rosary Pamphlet, and you may ask your Chaplain to request blessed Rosaries from us.

April 1985, from Mission San Luis Rey Parish where he was assigned.
